OSCE/ODIHR workshop in Armenia highlights the importance of transparent policy-making and legislative planning

Evidence-based policy-making and legislative planning were the focus of a workshop in Tsaghkadzor, Armenia, organized by the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights, in co-operation with the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Armenia and the OSCE Office in Yerevan on 23 and 24 February 2015.

The workshop gathered some 40 representatives from the Ministries of Justice, Finance and Economics as well as from other governmental institutions, the National Assembly, the Human Rights Defender's Office and civil society. Participants discussed ways to improve the transparency and accessibility of the policy and legislative planning process and exchanged views on how best to involve policymakers and lawmakers, the public and relevant experts in the legislative planning framework. The workshop also focused on ways to enhance co-operation between institutions in the process of policy-making and legislative planning.

Latvian Presidency of the EU and cooperation with Armenia

12, February, 2015 the representative of AEGEE-Yerevan Mrs. Haykuhi Tangyan participated in international 'Latvian conference Presidency of the European Union priorities and areas of cooperation with Armenia. The conference was organized by the Analytical Center on Globalization and Regional Cooperation (ACGRC) NGO and the Embassy of the Republic of Latvia' and took place at Best Western Congress Hotel. Belarus

The leaders of Russia, Ukraine, France and Germany have reached a ceasefire deal after 17 hours of talks in Minsk, Belarus, on the Ukrainian conflict

The ceasefire will come into force on Sunday as part of a deal that also involves the withdrawal of heavy weapons from the front line.

Russian president Vladimir Putin was the first to announce the deal, saying: "We have agreed on a ceasefire from midnight 15 February."

Putin added: "There is also the political settlement. The first thing is constitutional reform that should take into consideration the legitimate rights of people who live in Donbass. There are also border issues. Finally there are a whole range of economic and humanitarian issues."

Georgia

What will the education reform bring to Georgia?

Due to Mukhran Guliashvili, head of the NGO School Research Center, the education system in Georgia didn't change since the 19th century and is therefore built on the needs of an industrial economy rather than innovation and general knowledge. According to surveys and research the pupils' education levels as well as the teachers' qualifications are low.

As part of the reform the school subject "civil education" was introduced, however it didn't assist the pupils in becoming active citizens and most of them can't find any practical use for it.

To reform and improve the education system a very strict and well-oiled teacher selection system, better salaries and a good infrastructure is needed. The Georgian government only spends 2.4 percent of its income on education. Meanwhile countries with successful education systems spend at least 4 percent.

Guliashvili states that "successful police and bureaucratic reforms give me hope that education reform will also bear fruit. In general, comprehensive reforms will help schools raise critically thinking citizens rather than obedient drones".

The EU has included education in the action plan from 2013 to 2015 aiming to support reforms in primary and secondary schools based on the principles of human rights and democracy and taking into account European standards and practice. Check this for more information!

Reporters Without Borders: Media freedom has improved in Georgia

Reporters without Borders ranked Georgia in 69th place among 180 countries, while it was 84th in 2014 and 100th in 2013

The Index evaluated each country in seven categories: pluralism, media independence, environment and self-censorship, legislative framework, transparency and

high-level officials from Armenia and Latvia, number of deputies of the National Assembly, NGO representatives, journalists, academicians, students and representatives of international organizations accredited in Armenia.

Donetsk rebels announce full heavy weapons withdrawal in Ukraine

Ukrainian rebels have withdrawn all heavy weapons in Donetsk relocated 80 percent of hardware in Lugansk, appropriate for the Minsk-2 peace agreements. The ceasefire came into effect on 15 February but the rebels seized the key town of Debaltseve just days later. About 5,800 people have died since then, the UN has estimated, although it believes the real figure could be considerably higher.

At first glance, Kiev's announcement that its forces would start to withdraw heavy weapons from the front line is positive news - and possibly a sign that the two sides are finally carrying out the Minsk agreement.But making sure the deal sticks will remain a day-to-day struggle. Moldova

Moldova's parliament picks pro-EU premier

Almost three months after elections in Moldova (November 30th), the parliament finally chose a new prime minister. Chiril Gaburici, a pro-European businessman, was elected with 60 out of 101 votes.

This could be interpreted as a relief after having a political crisis caused by the rejection of former prime minister Iurie Leanca. The minority government formed by two pro-European parties failed to win support from the Communists and his former ally, the Liberal Party, which went out of coalition negotiations after some disagreements.

On the other hand, some observers are pessimistic about Moldova's future because Chiril Gaburici, as a businessman, has no political experience. Moreover, they fear that further mixing of business and politics will increase corruption in Moldova's political system.

Even though the new prime minister said that "the question of Moldova's European integration remains in focus", the minority government will still depend on the support of the Communist Party. With the currency falling and the remaining conflict in Transnistria, one can only hope that the weak government will be able to reach its goals.
